INTERSCHUTZ, LEIPZIG CONVENTION CENTRE, LEIPZIG, GERMANY, 7-12 JUNE

Once every five years, firefighters from all over the world gather in Germany to attend Interschutz, the world's largest fire, rescue and emergency exhibition. This summer from the 7th to the 12th of June, Interschutz is to be held in Leipzig at the Leipzig Exhibition Centre, where over 1,139 exhibitors from 45 different countries will have the latest technology and services on show. Apart from the latest equipment and services, spectacular demonstrations will be held around five fully booked halls. Every day from 10:00 am onwards until 5:30 PM, the open air site of Interschutz is staging realistic demonstrations of rescue operations and disaster scenarios, which can be viewed from the stand by up to 3,000 attendees at the same time. One very popular event is the contest for the world's toughest firefighter. The winner is decided in four trials in which two firefighters compete against each other in full turnout gear.

Stephan Ph. Kühne, Deutsche Messe's Vice President in charge of Interschutz, is pleased to announce that, with just a month to go until the start of the expo, the exhibition halls are already completely booked out. "This year's Interschutz is going to be considerably bigger than in 2005. So far we've received over 1,309 exhibitor registrations – that's 134 exhibitors, or about 11 percent, more than five years ago. The show's international participation rate has also increased. In fact, its commercial section will for the first time have more international exhibitors than German ones (620 vs. 578). Most of the international contingent will come from China, France, Canada, Poland and Turkey."

Just as in 2005, Stephan Ph. Kühne anticipates that Interschutz 2010 in Leipzig will attract more than 100,000 international visitors, of whom 95 percent will be emergency and rescue sector professionals, of whom, in turn, around 70 percent will be senior managers with decisive input into their organisations' capital spending decisions. "The visitor statistics will be impressive, thanks in large measure to the joint promotion campaign by the exhibitors and Deutsche Messe. The organisers and sponsors are also confident Interschutz will have a wider range of exhibits than ever before, not in the least because of the show's unique combination of commercial and non-commercial exhibitors. GFPA President Hans Jochen Blätte said: "The GFPA is expecting a large number of innovations that will make working life easier for emergency and rescue professionals and improve overall job safety." Stephan Ph. Kühne is equally confident about the upcoming expo's thematic diversity: "Interschutz will remain true to form as a tradeshow for new product and technology launches, and will feature more innovations than ever before. We are expecting growth in all display categories, particularly in the areas of technical fire protection, rescue, and personal protective equipment."

The show is also set to have its own radio station, RADIO 112 - a new first.

A February 2010 report by Visiongain valued sales in the global CBRN defence market at a staggering \$7.9 billion for 2009 and analysts anticipate that this figure will only grow as the technology available to would-be terrorists expands.

With such high investment in equipment to detect, prevent and respond to CBRN attacks, our domestic forces need to be equipped with not only the best technology but the best training to go with it, in order to best equip ourselves to cope with the impact of attack.

It could be argued that the 2010 Olympics make the UK more prone to CBRN attack and so investment in CBRN is key for national security for the UK in this time.

On speaking to CBRNe, Chief Superintendent Andrew Sigsworth, Head of the UK's Police National CBRN Centre, commented: "As it stands I see the Olympics as a driver likely to encourage commitment, not as a problem." He went on to say "The commitment of forces across the UK

to CBRN is frankly commendable. We have seen and continue to see increases in numbers of trained responders at all levels and I am extremely encouraged by the current trend."

The London Olympics highlight that the threat of attack is constant and our forces should always be prepared, therefore it is imperative that knowledge, new ideas and communication methods are shared to develop the best strategies to respond to a CBRN incident.

The 2010 CBRN Resilience Conference aims to gather professionals in the industry from emergency services and the military to collectively demonstrate these best practices on how to manage and decontaminate a CBRN incident.

FIVE, GOTHENBURG, SWEDEN, 29-30 SEPTEMBER

Fires in vehicles pose a significant threat to life and property. Recently, fires in buses have been in focus due to catastrophic incidents. Train fires are also high on the research agenda due to recent European-based research projects such as TRANSFEU. A nightmare scenario is a large vehicle fire in a tunnel. At the same time new fuels and electrical vehicles are emerging in response to our need for sustainable transport alternatives. Such alternative vehicles introduce new fire challenges that need to be accounted for.

In response to the pressing need for international dialogue SP Technical Research is organising a new conference: FIVE (Fires In Vehicles). The objective of this conference is to exchange knowledge of fires in vehicles, including both road and rail vehicles. In recognition of the fact that many of the fire problems faced by these vehicles are the same, the solutions to them can also be similar.

FIVE will bring together scientists, regulators, test engineers, industry, suppliers, insurance companies and other organisations from the diverse field of transportation to discuss important fire issues. We believe that this exchange of knowledge will significantly enhance economic and safe solutions – sustainable solutions – to problems in the fire area.

FIVE will be a biannual event, the first conference of which will take place in Gothenburg as the opening site for this event as it is the centre of the West Coast Region, the automotive science centre of Sweden. For more information, visit: www.firesinvehicles.com
